Volunteer Opportunity for Young Adults Continues Through July

There is still time for teens to volunteer at the library this summer. Young adults ages 12-18 can listen to younger children read aloud in our Chapter Chums program.

Teens can choose to use their volunteer hours to gain community service credit for school honor societies or college applications, or they can use the volunteer hours to "work off" their library fines. Every 15 minutes spent listening to a child read will take off \$3.00 in library fines. Volunteers working toward service credits will receive a

letter from the library documenting their time.

TEXAS CITY READS 2010


This October, prepare to take a literary journey abroad to the darkest jungles of the Amazon...we've picked the non-fiction book *The Lost City of Z: a tale of deadly obsession in the Amazon* by David Grann as the Texas City Reads book of 2010.

After stumbling across the mystery of famed explorer Percy Fawcett's disappearance while searching for a lost civilization in the thick of the Amazonian rainforest, author David Grann (a confirmed lover of air conditioning) finds himself drawn to the forests of the Amazon to investigate the mystery himself. Grann explores the life and legend of Percy Fawcett as well as the "green hell" of the Amazon rainforest in this fast-paced, true-life biographical mystery. Grann is an excellent storyteller, weaving historical and scientific fact seamlessly into this fascinating narrative. The book appeared on several "best books" non-

fiction lists of 2009.

The library has purchased multiple copies of *The Lost City of Z*, which are currently available for check-out at the Circulation Desk.

Last year our bookworm, Sir Read-A-Lot, had 450 circles, representing 4500 hours of reading by members of our community. To beat that number this year, we need you to keep on reading! Kids age 3-8 who read 40 stories by August 16th get a book prize. Kids who

read an additional 40 stories will get another prize. Kids 3 -5 can have 40 stories read to them and ages 6-8 will read their own stories. Kids age 9-12 will get a book prize for every 10 hours they

read. Teens and adults will receive a raffle ticket for every 10 hours they read for a chance to win a gift card. Eligible reading material can include books, magazines, newspapers, internet articles, and audiobooks.

KIDS CAN READ OFF FINES THIS SUMMER

The library does not want fines to keep children from reading this summer! Children are encouraged to clear their blocked cards and practice their reading skills with a teen mentor in our Chapter Chum program. Children up to age twelve can reduce their book fines \$3.00 for every fifteen minutes of reading. Chapter Chums are available to listen to children read off their fines from 1-3 PM Monday through Friday, during the months of June and July. Interested children should report to the Reference Desk.

Please note that this program applies only to book fines and not fines from lost or damaged materials. Children may only read off their own fines, not those of other family members.
